SECTION 4: First aid measures

Description of first aid measures

If inhaled

Move the victim into fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration and consult a doctor immediately.

Following skin contact

Take off contaminated clothing immediately. Wash off with soap and plenty of water. Consult a doctor.

Rinse with pure water for at least 15 minutes. Consult a doctor.

Following ingestion

Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Call a doctor or Poison Control Center immediately.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

SYMPTOMS: Symptoms of exposure to this chemical are eye, skin and upper respiratory tract irritation. Other symptoms of exposure may include a burning sensation, shortness of breath, headache, laryngitis, nausea and vomiting. Inhalation may be fatal as a result of spasm, inflammation and edema of the larynx and bronchi, chemical pneumonitis and pulmonary edema. ACUTE/CHRONIC HAZARDS: This compound is corrosive to the mucous membranes, upper respiratory tract, eyes and skin. It is harmful if ingested, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. When heated to decomposition it may emit toxic fumes of hydrogen chlorides. (NTP, 1992)



SECTION 6: Accidental release measures
