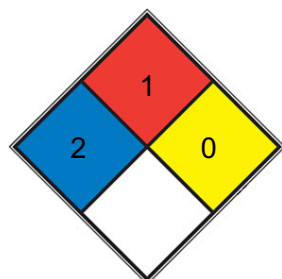
## Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical
